



Nature exploration hike to Fürthermoaralm.

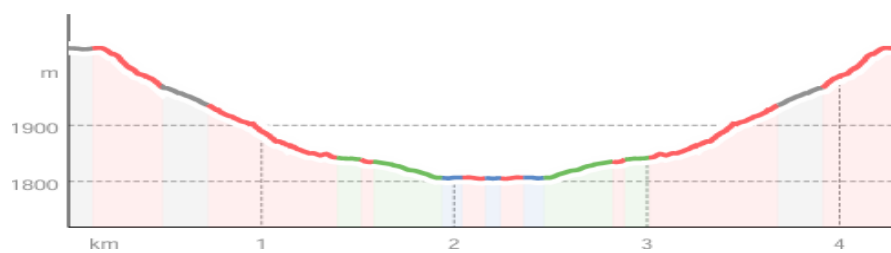
Discover the fauna and flora of the high mountains

- Level of difficulty:** Easy summer excursion on wide hiking trails.
- Equipment:** Sports or lightweight trekking shoes, rain and sun protection, appropriate clothing and a change of clothes, backpack with drinks and snacks.
- Costs:** €22. Children and teenagers (ages 7–16) accompanied by their parents are free of charge. Free with Guest Card or National Park SummerCard! For current transfer costs, please refer to www.kaprun-stauseen.com/preise.
- Dogs:** The presence of dogs is not allowed during excursions out of consideration for other participants and local wildlife.
- Meeting point:** Every Wednesday (from July 22, 2026 to September 9, 2026) at 10:00 a.m. at the Mooserboden mountain restaurant, at the National Park information hut; coordinates: N 47.16744, E 12.71504.
- How to reach us:** Travel is via Kaprun to the parking area at the Kesselfall Alpenhaus (approx. 15 minutes from Kaprun). From there, it is not possible to continue with your own vehicle. The ascent is made using shuttle buses and the inclined lift (Lärchwand funicular), which operate continuously without a fixed timetable. The first uphill ride starts at around 8:10 a.m., and the journey takes approximately 45 minutes. Further information on how to get there can be found at www.kaprun-stauseen.com/anreise.
- Duration:** Approximately 4 hours.
- Pure walking time:** Approximately 2 hours.
- Route:** Approximately 4,5 kilometers.
- Ascent:** Approximately 230 meters in altitude.
- Refreshment stops:** Refreshment options – Fürthermoaralm as well as the Mooserboden mountain restaurant after the tour.
- Booking:** Registration possible up to three hours before the tour starts at www.npht.at/kaprun-valley

Description: The guided ranger tour starts at the National Park information hut next to the Mooserboden mountain restaurant (Mooserboden plateau). From here, the trail gently descends, offering views of the impressive reservoirs and wide alpine meadows. Along the way, the ranger shares interesting insights into alpine nature, the local wildlife and plant life, as well as the history of the reservoirs and the Hohe Tauern National Park. Small streams and typical high-mountain flora line the path before reaching the Fürthermoaralm. The alpine pasture offers a pleasant resting place surrounded by mountain scenery before the tour returns along the same route to the Mooserboden mountain restaurant. From the starting point of the tour, bearded vultures can sometimes be observed at their roosting cliffs.
