

At the foot of the Mureck

From the Großarl Valley to the Kreealmen.

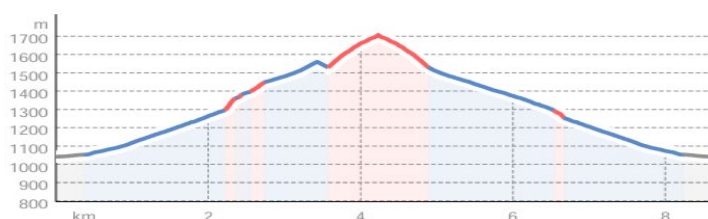
- Level of difficulty:** Moderate summer excursion on well-developed paths with a destination above the valley floor;
- Equipment:** Sports or lightweight trekking shoes, rain and sun protection, appropriate clothing and a change of clothes, backpack with drinks and snacks.
- Costs:** €22 for adults. Children and adolescents (10-16 years old) accompanied by their parents are free. Free with a guest card or Nationalpark SommerCard!
- Dogs:** Dogs are not allowed during excursions out of consideration for other participants and local wildlife.
- Meeting point:** Every Thursday (from July 16 to September 10, 2026) at 9:00 a.m. at the National Park information hut in Hüttschlag (coordinates: 47.14807, 13.28720).
- How to reach us:** Follow the road through Großarl and Hüttschlag to the end of the valley. The drivable road ends at the parking area at the valley head.
- Duration:** Approximately 5 hours.
- Pure walking time:** Approximately 4,5 hours.
- Route:** Approximately 8,5 kilometers.
- Ascent:** Approximately 700 meters in altitude.
- Refreshment stops:** Registration possible up to three hours before the start of the tour at [shortlink](https://www.npht.at/kreealm-en)
- Booking:** Registration possible until three hours before the beginning of the tour at [npht.at/kreealm-en](https://www.npht.at/kreealm-en)

Description: The guided ranger tour in the Hohe Tauern National Park begins at the Talwirt in Hüttschlag. The path leads along alpine trails and through light mountain forests into the Kreealm Valley, accompanied by the sound of rushing streams.

A particular highlight of the tour is a detour to the Kreealm waterfall, where large volumes of water plunge spectacularly into the valley – an ideal spot for a short break and photos. Along the way, the ranger provides insights into alpine nature, wildlife, and traditional alpine farming.

At the end of the valley, participants reach the Kreealmen, idyllically situated on sunny alpine meadows. After a relaxed break, the return route follows the same path back to the parking area at the Talwirt.
