



Easy ski tour Via the Rauris Primeval Forest to the Kolmkarspitze (2529 m)

Route: Ascent: approx. 970 metres in elevation, 5 km

Descent: approx. 1,300 metres in elevation, 9 km



- Basic knowledge of avalanche transceiver, shovel, and probe
- Ability to handle own ski touring equipment
- ☐ Off-piste skiing ability
- ☐ Ascend using a maximum of 1–2 switchbacks

Number of participants: min. 3, max. 6

Short description: From the Lenzanger car park, the tour leads through easy terrain in the picturesque Rauris Primeval Forest. After fresh snowfall, the forest looks especially beautiful. The further ascent to the Kolmkarspitze is rewarded with a view of the Rauris Sonnblick.

Contents: The natural history and historical aspects of this area are particularly fascinating and will be covered during the tour.

- ☐ Rauris Primeval Forest (spruce, larch, stone pine)
- ☐ Animal tracks + adaptation strategies of forest inhabitants in winter
- ☐ Mining history in the Hüttwinkl Valley

Directions: From Rauris, follow the road up the valley to the barrier at Bodenhaus. There is a large paid car park there.

Schedule: From the meeting point, the group takes a taxi together to the Lenzanger car park. The ski tour then begins with an ascent through the picturesque Rauris Primeval Forest. From the open area of the Durchgangsalm, the destination is already visible. The ascent continues over relatively gentle terrain via the Seekopf to the Kolmkarspitze. Depending on snow conditions, a descent option back to the Durchgangsalm is also possible. On the descent, no taxi is required. If snow conditions are sufficient, it is possible to ski all the way back to the car park.

Terms of participation: The National Park administration reserves the right to adapt the tour to the abilities of the participants and to conduct it only if weather and avalanche conditions permit, and if participants are properly equipped and physically fit. Participants must be of legal age to join this tour.

Participants are requested to report any health issues that could affect the safe conduct of the tour, so that appropriate precautions can be taken (e.g., insect sting allergy, asthma, diabetes, cardiovascular conditions, hip, knee, or ankle problems, etc.). All participants travel together as a group. Leaving the group in alpine terrain is not allowed. If progress is not possible due to health or fitness reasons, the entire group will turn back together. Participation is not possible without the required minimum equipment listed for each person.
