## The panorama of the Hohe Tauern bathed in golden light

**Level of difficulty**: Easy snowshoe hike or winter walk through gentle terrain, with a relatively short

walking duration.

**Equipment:** Sturdy, ankle-high footwear (ideally hiking boots); warm socks, ski poles, warm

clothing (including hat and gloves), backpack with hot drinks and snacks.

**Costs:** € 22,- adults; Children and young people (10–16 yrs) free when accompanied

by their parents. Free with the "Gästecard" or Nationalpark WinterCard!

**Included in price:** Snowshoe and ski stick hire (please advise when booking)

**Dogs:** Bringing dogs along is not permitted during excursions out of

consideration for other participants and the local wildlife.

**Booking**: Up to three hours before the start of the excursion.



**Description:** Starting from the Youth Guesthouse Dietsteinhof, the sunset hike first follows a winter hiking trail and a cross-country ski track before branching off onto a gentle rise. From there, an impressive view opens up of the Hohe Tauern mountain panorama, bathed in warm evening light. The tour continues toward Wasenmoos, which is a protected natural area. The return route passes through a quiet forest section, offering atmospheric impressions at dusk. An unforgettable nature experience and a true highlight of your winter holiday!
