



Golden Views Mittersill

The panorama of the Hohe Tauern bathed in golden light

- Level of difficulty:** Easy snowshoe hike or winter walk through gentle terrain, with a relatively short walking duration.
- Equipment:** Sturdy, ankle-high footwear (ideally hiking boots); warm socks, ski poles, warm clothing (including hat and gloves), backpack with hot drinks and snacks.
- Costs:** € 22,- adults; Children and young people (10–16 yrs) free when accompanied by their parents. Free with the "Gästecard" or Nationalpark WinterCard!
- Included in price:** Snowshoe and ski stick hire (please advise when booking)
- Dogs:** Bringing dogs along is not permitted during excursions out of consideration for other participants and the local wildlife.
- Meeting point:** Tuesday, January 20, 2026 at 2:00 p.m.;
Thursday, February 19, 2026 at 2:30 p.m.;
Friday, March 20, 2026 at 3:00 p.m.;
Meeting point: Youth Guesthouse Dietsteinhof, Paßthurn 7, 5730 Mittersill
- How to reach us:** By bus to the "Pass Thurn Dietsteinhof" stop or car directly to the Dietsteinhof youth hostel, (NS 47.29516, WO 12.43502).
- Duration:** Approx. 3.5–4 hours
- Pure walking time:** Approx. 1.5–2 hours
- Route:** Approx. 4.5–5 kilometres
- Ascent:** Approx. 150 vertical metres
- Refreshment stops:** Various options possible
- Booking:** Up to **three hours** before the start of the excursion.

- Description:** Starting from the Youth Guesthouse Dietsteinhof, the sunset hike first follows a winter hiking trail and a cross-country ski track before branching off onto a gentle rise. From there, an impressive view opens up of the Hohe Tauern mountain panorama, bathed in warm evening light. The tour continues toward Wasenmoos, which is a protected natural area. The return route passes through a quiet forest section, offering atmospheric impressions at dusk. An unforgettable nature experience and a true highlight of your winter holiday!

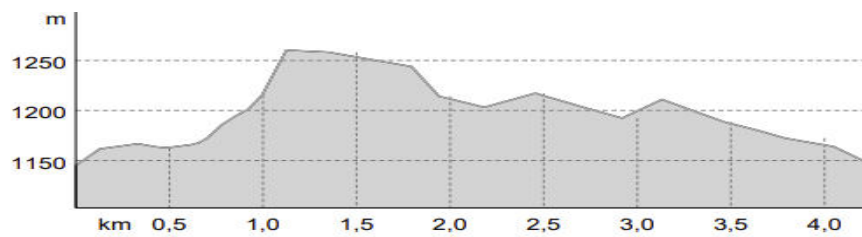
