

To the Kleine Eiser – 2897m (ski tour)

Level of difficulty: Difficult ski tours that require very good fitness and partial fearlessness of heights, with more than 5 hours of total walking time and/or steeper terrain; guided by a certified mountain guide.

Equipment: Ski touring equipment (skis, sticks, skins, crampons, helmet), winter clothing, change of clothes, alpine rucksack with warm drinks and snacks, sun and cold protection;

Costs: € 40 per person

Participants: min. 2 people, max. 6 people

Hire: Avalanche equipment (please advise when booking)

Meeting point: Friday, April 4, 2025, at the valley station Weißsee Gletscherwelt; the time will be arranged promptly with the mountain guide upon registration.
Coordinates: N 47.17092, W 12.62692.

How to reach us: At the roundabout in Uttendorf, turn towards Stubachtal – Enzingerboden – Weißsee and follow the road for 16 km to the Enzingerboden parking lot.

Duration: Approx. 8 hrs

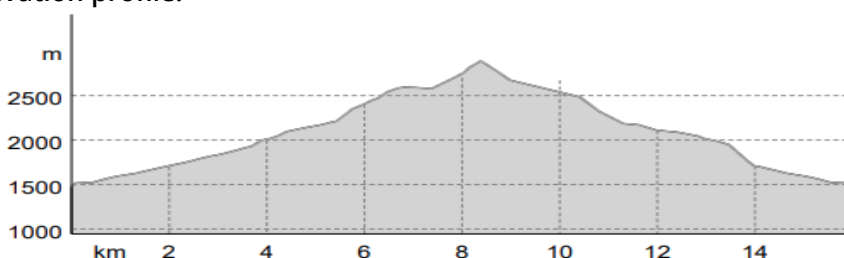
Ascent: Approx. 1420 vertical metres and 4 kilometres

Descent: Approx. 1420 vertical metres and 4 kilometres

Description: A somewhat remote summit south of the popular Hocheiser. The first section of the tour follows the ascent route to the Hocheiser. At Schwarzkarl, this rarely traveled route leads over the Kleineiser lakes to the last remnants of the Kleineiser glacier. Secured by a rope, the final steeper meters to the Eiserscharte and further to the summit are overcome. The view of the impressive and crevasse-rich upper Riffelkees and the surrounding 3000-meter peaks makes this effort definitely worthwhile. If conditions do not allow for the ascent to the summit of the Kleine Eiser, there is also the option to climb the easier but equally rewarding western sub-summit. The descent follows the ascent route.
