





Snowshoe hike to the Rötenkogel

Level of difficulty: Alpine snowshoe hike that requires excellent physical condition, with more

than 5 hours of total hiking time and/or steeper terrain; led by a

state-certified mountain guide

Equipment: Sturdy, ankle-high footwear (ideally hiking boots); warm socks,

ski sticks, warm clothing (including hat and gloves), sunscreen,

alpine rucksack with warm drinks and snacks

Costs: € 40 per person

Included in price: Snowshoe and ski stick hire (please advise when booking).

Meeting point: Thursday, 30th January 2025, Thursday, 13th February 2025 and

Thursday, 27th February 2025, Valley station Weißsee Gletscherwelt.

How to reach us: By ski transfer (please follow the information from the tourist office) or car to

the Enzingerboden car park. Ski transfer is highly dependent on the

operation of the Weißsee Glacier World cable cars!

Ascent: Approx. 680 vertical metres **Refreshment stops**: Possible at the end of the tour



Description: From the meeting point at Enzingerboden, a snow-covered forest path leads through a tunnel into a coniferous forest with ancient spruces, larches, and stone pines. In the Rötentrög region, you may spot nutcrackers. Through gentle snowshoe terrain, you will reach a rewarding viewpoint above the Schusterschwärzer. The hike continues over steeper terrain towards Rötenkarl, with the option to ascend either the Rötenkogel or the Schwarzkarlriedl. From here, you will enjoy a breathtaking view of the deeply snow-covered peaks such as Hocheiser, Hohe Riffl, and Granatspitze. The descent follows a more direct route back to the meeting point.
